Edge of the World Theater Festival's Future Project Presents "Sneak Peeks" at 24th Street Theatre

On Sunday, May 1, participants in EdgeFest's Future Project will present half-hour "works-in-progress" versions of the original scripts they are creating for presentation in fall 2005. A 10-minute audience feedback session will follow each presentation, and evaluation forms will be available for further comments.

The Future Project is the EdgeFest program created to develop plays and audiences of the future. This year's participants are The MET Theatre, Silverlake Children's Theatre Group, Towne Street Theatre and Zoo District.

Works-in-progress will include:

The MET Theatre: *Amelia Learns to Fly.*

A little girl from Kansas grows up to become one of the greatest pilots ever. The courageous life of Amelia Earhart.

Silverlake Children's Theatre Group: *The Window.* A group of high school kids are accidentally vacuum-trapped inside a posh art gallery in Las Vegas. When attempts to break the window in the room fail, someone suggests using a priceless Michelangelo statue to break the glass. A life and-death struggle over art – and eventually theology - erupts as their oxygen supply dwindles...

Towne Street Theatre Company: *BAD BOBBY BOLINGO and the DINOSAUR CAVE.* A humorous fantasy about a girl whose bad behavior sends her on a wild adventure to a land where dinosaurs rule by brain, not brawn. It is a darkly comical tale of redemption and self-discovery as Bobbi learns the meanings of tolerance, fairness, honesty and personal responsibility.

Zoo District: *The Boy King.* Your father was a heretic. Your mother is banished. You have been handed a powerful kingdom, on the verge of revolt. An entire country is yours to rule as you wish. Your Generals distrust you. Your councilor tells you to marry. You are Tutankhamen. You are 9 years old. What do you do?
